Safeguarding West Brookwood's drinking water from pollution is the Water Department's #1 priority. In order to do this, state and federal water quality tests are performed and the Licensed Operator, Field Technician and Water Department Administrator routinely inspect the well sites.

From the amount of poop found at both locations, seen deposited on residential lawns and along our roadways, it is clearly apparent certain pet owners who walk their dogs are not picking up their pet's droppings. Is it because of a busy lifestyle, laziness or just ignorance that failure to clean up after your pet poses a serious health issue?

As far back as 1991, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) deemed pet waste as a major source of water pollution along with oil and toxic chemicals. Besides being toxic to your lawn and bushes, causing burning and discoloration, dog droppings are a health hazard for both humans and their pets.

When humans are exposed to Nitrates and fecal coliform bacteria found in dog waste, cramps, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, intestinal illness and serious kidney disorders occur. Pets become ill when they come in contact with another animal's waste that harbors Heartworm, Roundworm, Tapeworm, Hookworm Eggs, or the deadly Parvo Virus.

To safeguard our customer's drinking water, the Water Departments is posting signs and asks all pet owners not to walk their animals on Water Department property. If the Water Department continues to find pet waste at both well sites costly steps will be taken to find and prosecute the offenders under Chapter 245, General Provisions, Byram Township Board of Health.
