Basic Service Rate Increase

The Water Department has made every attempt to keep a lid on costs; however, there have been increases in Laboratory fees, Insurance, Electricity and Maintenance since our last rate increase in 2009.

To continue quality of service to our water customers, starting January 2012, we must increase basic service by \$1.00 per month for residential customers and \$1.50 per month for commercial customers. There will be **no** rate increase for water usage.

GET READY FOR WINTER

Cooler temperatures signal a time of year to start thinking about preparing your home for winter. Listed below are a few Water Department tips to help you prepare for winter's chill.

Locate your water main inside shut-off valve, test to see if it is operational. If not, have it replaced. Place a tag to identify the inside shut-off valve and have everyone in your household know where the valve is located in case of an emergency.

Inspect your home for exterior cracks and exposed entry points where water pipes enter your home and the water meter is located. Seal and insulate these areas to prevent freezing. If you are away from your home for a period of time, leave the heat on; set the thermostat to at least 55 degrees.
