Cold Weather Awareness

As outside temperatures fall below 32 degrees, plumbing water pipes and the water meter in your home are at risk of damage from freezing. The first sign that your pipes are freezing is reduced water flow from a faucet.

If a problem occurs, it is important that everyone in your home knows where the homes main shutoff valve, supply valve for your washing machine and the valve for the hot water heater are located. The following tips listed below can help you safeguard your home:

- Disconnect gardening hoses, store hoses in garage and shut off water supply leading to the outside faucets
- · Locate what areas in your home at risk to freezing conditions
- Weather-strip and caulk gaps around windows and exterior doors and especially in the areas that are located near water pipes and the meter
- Insulate basement walls and crawl spaces
- Wrap water pipes near exterior walls and pipes leading to your water meter with pipe insulation
- Open cabinet doors below sinks in the kitchen and bathroom to allow heat from the home to circulate to keep pipes from freezing
- Always keep your home heated especially if you plan to be away for an extended period of time
- Make it a habit to check water flow and pressure when you first awake and before you go to sleep
